

Dr. Linda Langford

Dr. Linda Langford has been an associate Center director at Education Development Center, Inc. (EDC) since 1998. She has been an Evaluation Scientist at the Suicide Prevention Resource Center since 2006, previously co-managing the Best Practices Registry for Suicide Prevention and currently providing training and expert consultation on an array of prevention issues including communications, strategic planning, evaluation, and translating research to practice. She provided an April 2009 briefing on safe and effective suicide prevention messaging and stigma reduction to the Department of Defense Task Force on the Prevention of Suicide by Members of the Armed Forces, and she serves as a subject matter expert on Make the Connection, the VA's national antistigma campaign. She also directs the violence prevention initiatives at the U.S. Department of Education's Higher Education Center for Alcohol, Drug Abuse, and Violence Prevention, a national center that provides training and technical assistance to colleges and universities. From 1998 to 2005, she was an Assistant Clinical Professor at Tufts University School of Medicine, teaching a core course in strategic planning for health behavior change in the health communications program. Dr. Langford holds a doctorate in social and behavioral sciences from the Harvard School of Public Health.

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
